Medications Medication Function Furosemide Causes kidneys to get rid of unneeded water and salt through urine to reduce swelling and fluid retention, also used for high BP Atenolol Beta blocker, relaxes the blood vessels and slows the heart rate to improve blood flow, is used to decrease BP Lisinopril Treats high BP and improves survival after a heart attack as an ACE inhibitor blocking
